Dentist Ana has always supported us by providing dental check-ups to all children over the course of 4 years. Additionally, for those who need extractions, she performs them as a courtesy. Furthermore, Obie donated a special chair for the children to receive dental care.





HEALTH PROJECT

The Ministry of Health of Guatemala, through the Health Center, supported us by providing vaccines to adolescent girls to prevent cervical cancer. Additionally, they vaccinated all children to prevent future diseases.

VOLUNTEERING PROJECT

Obie has been involved in volunteering over 3 years, such as in 2023 when he volunteered for three months. Additionally, he collaborated by purchasing toilets, sinks, and other donations.




Contemposite Conte






In April, we received support from parents and some donors for the purchase of windows and doors for the second level of the building.

Each mother was assigned to volunteer in the kitchen and cleaning. Those who couldn't participate made a donation of Q.50.00 (\$6.40) per day. In total, 3 mothers volunteered each day.

INDUSTRIAL SAFETY PROJECT

Ronny, an industrial safety specialist, provided training on first aid and the use of fire extinguishers. Additionally, another workshop is pending. Four fire extinguishers were purchased. Two complete first aid kits were donated by Forrest. Currently, signage is pending.











We received piñatas as a gift from the bookstore where we are customers. A group of donors gifted pizzas, and we also had a visit from Forrest and Jack from the USA, who donated soccer goals and toys for all the children.




STUDENT WELL-BEING PROJECT

Licensed clinical psychologist Alicia was contacted, and she donated therapy sessions to 7 children from different grades every 15 days for 3 months. Additionally, she provided an informative talk to a small group of mothers about the importance of mental health and offered a therapy session to each mother of the children who attended.







Socioeconomic Socioeconomic Study PROJECT

For the completion of the socioeconomic study of the children studying at the school, Licensed Social Worker Lidia was hired. She donated more than half of her fees, and the remainder was covered by the donation received from Forrest.





BLESSING AND INAUGURATION PROJECT

In addition to other donors, we had the support of the company Gallo, which donated the rental of furniture, 10 tents, 3 freezers, 600 chairs, and 100 tables.

CHILD CHILD NUTRITIONIST PROJECT

We secured the support of the child nutritionist, Melly, who made a visit and offered to design a monthly nutritional plan for the well-being of all children according to their ages and needs. Additionally, she had a gathering with the Stage II grade, where she gifted them a set of utensils (cups, plates, and a toy) and provided snacks for the entire grade.

PARENTING SCHOOL PROJECT



Workshops for parents were conducted with the support of Thanatologist Lucía, aiming to assist the community with topics related to assertive parenting.





We received a visit from the young Jack from the USA, who wanted to experience volunteering with the children at the school. A daily program was developed with activities aimed at providing children with a natural immersion in the English language through play and reading.

TRAINING FOR TEACHERS PROJECT

Two workshops were organized for the operational staff and educational staff of the school. One focused on industrial safety, and the other on educating students about changes during puberty.



WORKSHOP FOR ADOLESCENTS PROJECT





Maria, a sexual educator, conducted a workshop for fourth and fifth-grade students. Additionally, she donated the book 'Tell Me Everything,' which is a manual aimed at helping each child learn about the changes during puberty.

Several individuals were contacted and invited to learn about the project, and many of them became volunteers. They provided workshops and made in-kind donations, among other contributions.


